

## Covid-19 Americas Travel and Containment Information Sheet

17.03.2020

**Analyst Message:** The FGA Security Team has reason to believe that many governments will enact or continue to enact new emergency measures in the coming days if not hours. We will continue to update you as best we can.

**About:** The following is a brief overview of travel restrictions and containment measures for countries in the Americas. This is a work in progress and efforts are being made to improve the collection and centralization of relevant inputs. Data collection was performed manually, and sources include national foreign ministries, embassies and consular missions abroad, and select newspapers of record.

**Note:** Keep in mind, information on this sheet is subject to rapid change. *This should be referenced as a starting point only.* **Travelers and their stakeholders are strongly encouraged to perform regular due diligence on travel destinations and transit routes before embarking on international travel as containment measures and travel restrictions change by the hour.**

Country	Travel Restrictions and Containment Measures	Recent Developments
Argentina	<p>Travellers coming from "affected areas" in the last 14 days will be banned from entering the country. These areas include United States, China, South Korea, Iran, Japn, Great+C4:C83 Britain and Northern Ireland, and Europe. The ban will be in place for the next 30 days starting on the 12th of March. the ban also include travellers arriving on transit flights with a stop in between. From the 17th of March only Aerolineas Argentina will be authorized to fly from the affected areas.</p> <p>Argentina will close its borders for non-residents for the next 15 days starting from the 16th of March.</p> <p>Schools will be suspended and national parks will be closed until the 31th March</p> <p>Accommodation can decline travellers from affected areas.</p>	

Brazil	Some countries are under monitoring for covid19; Germany, Australia, United Arab Emirates, Philippines, France, Iran, Italy, Malaysia, Japan, Singapore, South Korea, North Korea, Thailand, Vietnam, Cambodia, and China. Anyone entering the country from these areas are assessed for symptoms and isolated if symptomatic. Anyone suspected of being infected are being asked to self-isolate for 14 days after possible exposure.	*Azul Brazilian Airlines has from the 16th of March cancelled a majority of their international flights
Bolivia	16th of March: No travel restrictions	
Canada	The Canadian government is advising against all non-essential travel outside of Canada.	*On the 16th of March Canada closed its borders for non-residents with the exception of diplomats, US citizens and immediate family members of Canadian citizens. Incoming International flights will be limited to four airports (Toronto, Montreal, Calgary and Vancouver).
Chile	The country will close its borders from March the 18th for foreign travelers for a period of 14 days.	*The country will close its borders from March the 18th for foreign travelers for a period of 14 days.
Colombia	All seven border crossing between Colombia and Venezuela have been closed since the 13th of March.	*Starting from the 16th of March, all non-Colombian citizens or non-Colombian residents will be prohibited from arriving in the country and all arriving passengers will be advised to self-quarantine.
Ecuador		*From the 15th all borders will be closed for both foreigners and Ecuadorian residents. This will be in place at least for 21 days.
El Salvador	Since the 11th of March all foreigners have not been permitted access to El Salvador, only diplomats or legal permanent residents will be able to enter. The ban will last until the 31th of March.	

Guatemala		*Effective from 16th of March citizens from United States, China, South Korea, Canada, Italy, France, the United Kingdom and Iran are banned from entering the country
Guyana	The authorities are advising travelers from high-risk countries to self-quarantine for 14 days upon arrival. Additional screening measures have been implemented from countries identified as high-risk countries.	
Honduras		*all borders closed from the 15th of March and seven days onwards.
Mexico	No travel restrictions at this time.	*Schools will be closed countrywide from the 20th of March until 20th of April. *From the 23rd of March and until 19th of April a social-distancing campaign will run.
Panama	Travelers arriving from countries with documented cases are required to fill out a questionnaire. All travelers arriving will have their temperature taken and asked about recent travel. Cruise ship passengers are banned from disembarking in Panama as of 13th of March.	*From the 16th of March all public entertainment areas including bars and restaurants will close. There is no end date published.
Paraguay	Since the 10th of March schools and public gatherings have been banned. This will be in place for 15 days.	*The country is prohibiting entry of non-residents with limited exceptions from the 18th to the 30th of March. *From the 16th of March all public entertainment areas including bars and restaurants will close. There is no end date published. *From the 16th of March the government imposed a curfew between 08:00 Pm to 04:00 am.



Peru	<p>All docking of cruise ships are suspended from the 14th of March and for 30 days onwards.</p> <p>On the 13th of March the government issued a degree to suspend all flight to and from Europe and Asia beginning the 16th of March and lasting 30 days.</p> <p>Since the 12th of March all schools have been closed, this lockdown will stay in place until the 30th of March.</p>	<p>*On the 15th of March, Peru declared a national state of emergency, which will include a 15 days mandatory quarantine starting at midnight on the 16th of March. All borders will be closed.</p>
Trinidad and Tobago	<p>All schools are closed until the 30th of April.</p>	<p>*non-nationals will not be allowed into the country beginning on the 17th of March.</p> <p>Citizens or permanent resident with travel in the last 14 days to China, Iran, Italy, Japan, South Korea, Singapore, France, Germany and Spain will be quarantined.</p>
United States	<p>On the 13th of March, the president of the United States declared a national state of emergency. Thousands of universities have closed and multiple sports events have been cancelled.</p> <p>From the 11th of March all foreigners, who had within the last 14 days visited China, Iran or Europe, would be barred for entering. As of the 16th of March, the ban will also apply to the United Kingdom and Ireland.</p> <p>Citizens of the United States or legal permanent residents, who have been in high-risk areas are required to return to one of the 13 approved airports (BOS, ORD, DFW, DTW, HNL, ATL, JFK, LAX, MIA, EWR, SFO, SEA, IAD)</p> <p>Different states are taking different measures to contain the virus; California, Washington and other states have temporarily shot down all bars and restaurants.</p>	
Uruguay	<p>Travelers from Italy, China, South Korea, Japan, Singapore, Iran, France, Germany and Spain will be subject to a 14 days obligatory self-quarantine.</p>	
Venezuela	<p>No travel restrictions</p>
